Democrats Launch Website

Policy Differences with Incumbents Stressed

CAPE MAY COUNTY—Today Democratic Freeholder Candidates Robert Jackson and Steve Bacher launched their campaign website, www.BacherJackson.com. The site provides details on the candidates' stance on issues including bringing better jobs to the County, providing County law enforcement with the resources it needs to fight drugs and gangs, the need for long-term planning, and the potential to save taxpayers money while reducing carbon emissions through investment in wind and solar power, as already is being done in Atlantic County. It also includes MP3 files with the campaign's radio ads.

“Here are our plans. Here is what we would do differently. The current Freeholders aren't saying what their plans are, if they have any,” said former West Cape May Mayor Robert Jackson. “What is their vision for the future of the County? They're not saying. They're hoping no one is paying attention and they just get voted back in by default.”

“We offer a clear choice. The current Freeholders have been in power for too long. It's time for a change,” said Bacher, the Executive Director of Cape May's Center for Community Arts. “They are not interested in reducing waste and favoritism. Their spending has increased 38% in only seven years.”

“We will fight to keep Cape May County safe and preserve its natural beauty for future generations,” said Jackson.

The website also includes biographical information on the candidates, copies of press releases, and forms to request voter registration information, absentee ballot applications, and volunteer and donate to the campaign.
